#### Nantucket Organ Crawl Report By Maggie Bossi

On October 7, three recently retired board members Deb Gemma, Nancy McCarthy and Maggie Bossi traveled to Nantucket for the 32nd annual Organ Crawl. We had a blast! The theme for the year was "You're Playing THAT on The Organ???. Every recitalist presented organ transcriptions, in minitwenty minute programs, ranging from Vivaldi/Bach and Copland/Vozella to themes

from "Tommy" arranged by Jeff Cutts, and "This Is Halloween" by Danny Elfman. It was so fun to hear our fellow chapter members Kezia Duarte, a native Nantucketer, and Joe Hammer, a relatively recent arrival, play and host at their home churches.

We traipsed from sanctuary to sanctuary in the rain all morning, in a grand procession of at least 150 people visiting six different churches, all with mechanical action instruments. The oldest instruments, an Appleton and a Goodrich, date from 1831.



This means they were both installed before Herman Melville visited Nantucket in the 1860's, following the publication of Moby Dick! The newest instrument at St. Mary's is a Bigelow, installed in 2001.

Post-event, we wandered all over Nantucket town, and had a late lunch down by the ferry. Our ride home was enriched by fellow passenger Carson Cooman, one of the recitalists, and composer-in-residence at Memorial Chapel at Harvard. He was a wonderful and generous companion, and even sent me a copy of one of the pieces he had played.

This is a special and annual event that everyone should put on their calendar for Indigenous People's Day weekend, 2024.
